Skunk - Dry



Hook sz. 8-12 2xlong dry fly hook Thread 6/0 same color as body


Tail Woodchuck

Body Chenille tan, or other color

Legs Round rubber Wing Woodchuck Hackle Light Dun



Step 1: Start the thread and wind back to the bend of the hook. Tie in a short tuft of Woodchuck fur to for a stubby tail about 1/3 as long as the hook. Next tie in the chenille and wrap forward 1/2 way to the eye of the hook. Tie in the rubber legs and wind the chenille between them. Stop about two wraps in front of the legs and tie off the chenille.



Step 2: Tie in another small clump of Woodchuck fur to form a wing just s bit shorter than the body. Trim ends short.



Step 3: Tie in the hackle and wrap two turns. Tie off and finish.

This fly was first tied with black chenille, hence the name Skunk. It can be tied in a variety of colors and is a great fall fly to mimic a hopper of cricket.
