From the December 1997 3RFF Newsletter:

Winter is here and for some gives us a break in our fishing. This is a good time to go over our tackle and make repairs that we have been putting off since late summer. Todays high tech tackle while being as good as it gets still requires some maintenance. Below is a list of some things to look for while inspecting your gear.

Rod and Case

- Clean your rod with mild soap and water. Be sure to get the grim that builds up around the windings on the guides. Use a Q-tip to clean the inside of the ferrules. Sand and grit can build up in the inside to ferrules and when you least expect it, you will damage the ferrule with that sand.
- Dry every thing with a soft cloth. Use a magnifying glass and a Q-tip to inspect the guides and guide wraps. The Q-tip will help detect cuts in the guides that can play havoc with your expensive fly line. These cut guides can be polished smooth with a fine diamond hone, however, sooner or later that guide will need replaced. Don't forget the tiptop. Repair the guide wraps as necessary.
- Chips in your rods cork grip should be filled with cork dust and glue and then sanded smooth. If allowed to go unrepaired small chips will erode into holes that will then be a major repair.
- Clean your rod case and make any repairs that might be required. This is a good time to get out the sewing machine and repair that rod bag or make a new one if the old one is really worn.

Reel

• Todays reels are a marvel of manufacturing overkill. The precision and close tolerance with which these machines are made is comparable to that of a Swiss watch. Wash the ordinary grime off with mild soap and water. Use mineral spirits to clean the grease and oil out of the inside before relubricating. Inspect click pawls for wear. Small burrs that develop on the edge of these can be removed with an india stone or a diamond hone. This whole reel cleaning process I usually do after I return from Florida in the winter to be sure there is no salt residue left in the reel.

Line

• Pull your fly line off your reel and spare spools. Clean it with mild soap and water, dry with a soft cloth and apply a very thin coat of dressing. This is a good time to inspect the connections between your leader and fly line and between your fly line and backing.

Boots

• Clean your boots with warm water and dry. Repair any small snags or worn spots before they start to leak. Hang for the winter in a cool dark place. Some boot manufactures supply instructions of how best to take care or their products. Follow them if you still have them.

Vest

• Empty it! Get a box and put everything you did not use this past season in the box. Now hide the box. The one exception is your first aid kit and that we hope to never use. I am always amazed at the things that find their way into my vest over the course of a fishing season. Example: do I really need a pound roll hollow lead wire in my vest. You use this stuff an inch at a time. A pound of the size I use is about 40 feet!

Conclusion

- Spend the time now to do the little things you have been putting of since late summer of fall.
- Get your tackle into tip-top shape while you are not rushed. The time spent now will pay big dividends later on when you should be fishing and not messing around fixing something that needed attention all winter.
- Be ready for that bright January day when the cabin fever is about as bad as it can get and the only cure at hand is to find a place to go fishing for a few hours. Beats cleaning the garage.
